Thank you for meeting with the Black Student Justice Coalition and discussing our list of demands. We look forward to further dialogue and involvement policy process. We look forward to having discussion with all of the council as well to the implementation of the list of demands thank you.

- Community Representation in the Policy making process
 - Discussed making the #listofdemsands apart of the agenda so that the council can not only discuss but eventually put items to vote. This will also allow the community an opportunity to speak on these matters to the council during Council Sessions.
- Policy Process
 - Discussed converting the list of demands into policy
 - Discussed finding which policies are already in place that may mirror parts of the list of demands.
 - Discussed making amendments to those policies so that they can effectively meet the list of demands
 - Discussed staying in contact with your office as this process comes into fruition.
 - Mark Jones and Jordan Harrison agreed to stay in contact with your assistant in this regard.
- Discussed Police Data of arrest, searches, deaths etc. and how important it is to get this in front of the council. We believe the numbers will paint the picture of racial profiling and other important details the council should be made aware of.
 - Discussed the Police Executive Research Forum (PERT)
 - Discussed how the Council approved the Open Data Policy which will allow Police Data to be available to the public by 2016
- Discussed Labor Unions as lead negotiators of police
 - Mark Jones mentioned that while this is good they may at times protect police that should not be protected due to overuse of force or incidents such as Michael Brown and Eric Garner.
- Discussed having a clearly defined Use of Force Policy
 - Both the community and police officers need a clearly defined use of force policy
 - When is it appropriate for a police officer to use his billy club, tazer or other shows of force.
 - When is it appropriate for a police officer to pull their firearm on a citizen
 - What is the deciding factor that determines when a police officer will use deadly force on a citizen
 - Currently the Use of Deadly Force Policy is not known and needs to be clarified and

made aware for all parties involved.

- Civilian Review Board

- Discussed briefly why this board is currently not working
- Discussed how the Civilian Review Board needs to be community appointed not Mayor or City Council appointed
- Discussed that the Civilian Review Board needs to have more power to hold police officers accountable for overuse of force.
