**ORDER:**

- (1) FOLLOWING EARLY NEUTRAL EVALUATION CONFERENCE; and**
- (2) SETTING STATUS/CASE MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE**

On September 2, 2020, the Court held an Early Neutral Evaluation Conference. Pursuant to the discussion therein, the Court **ORDERS** the following:

1. By **October 16, 2020**, Defendants FAA and FCC are ordered to produce all releasable portions of documents that are responsive to Plaintiff’s Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”) requests, along with a Vaughn Index. Production shall be made on a rolling basis, meaning that documents shall be provided as they become releasable, before and up to October 16.<sup>1</sup>

1           2.     The Court **SETS** a status/case management conference for **October 21,**  
2 **2020** at **10:00 a.m.** to discuss the status of production and need for formal discovery.

5 name and title of everyone who will be attending the Zoom status conference, an e-mail  
6 address for each participant to receive the Zoom invitation, and a telephone number  
7 where each participant may be reached in the event of technical issues.

8           3.     The deadline for filing any dispositive motions for this case is set for  
9 **December 21, 2020.**
